## RESOLUTION NO. 21-92

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION IN THE AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING \$666,395.00 FOR FEDERAL FUNDS UNDER THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT AND DESIGNATING JAMES A. PRUGEL AS CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE PURPOSE OF GIVING REQUIRED ASSURANCES AND ACTING IN CONNECTION WITH SAID APPLICATION, AND DECLARING THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the City of Mesquite is entitled to certain funds under the Housing and Community Development Act of an amount not to exceed \$666,395.00 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds for the 1992-93 program year; and,

WHEREAS, the City has conducted public hearings; and,

WHEREAS, the Mesquite City Council has considered the suggestions and recommendations raised at the hearings; and,

WHEREAS, it is the public interest of the citizens of the City of Mesquite that application be made for such funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the 1992-93 Final Statement of Community Development Objectives and Projected Use of CDBG FUNDS is hereby approved and adopted by the City of Mesquite as its official 1992-93 Community Development Block Grant Program.

SECTION 2. James A. Prugel, City Manager of the City of Mesquite, is hereby authorized to file an application for funds under the Housing and Community Development Act on behalf of the City of Mesquite, Texas, and to certify to all understandings and assurances required under Federal Management Circular 74-4; National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Acts of 1964 and 1968 respectively, Executive Orders 11063 and 11246 and such other assurances and understandings as may be required.

SECTION 3. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage as the Charter in such cases provided.

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

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
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## OF OBJECTIVES AND PROJECTED USE 1992-1993 FUNDS CITY OF MESQUITE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

The Community Development objective of the City of Mesquite is to assure decent, viable living areas and conditions for low and moderate income residents through projects and activities which stabilize and improve low and moderate income neighborhoods by elimination of blighting influences and through the provision of public facilities and services. Activities proposed to be undertaken with available funds are as follows. Available funds for Grant Year 1992-93 total \$666,395.

1.	Latchkey Care Program\$ 99,959
	To continue providing after school care for low income Latchkey Children at Seabourn, Black, Shands, Hanby and Motley Elementary Schools.



A Program to provide building and facility accessibility to the disabled citizens of Mesquite.

4. Park Improvements......\$16,000

A Program for the construction of volleyball courts (couplet) at Evans Park.

5. Edgemont Park Improvements.....\$117,318

A Program of public improvements to the Edgemont Park area to include handicapp ramps, drainage, curb and sidewalk repairs.

6. Housing Rehabilitation Assistance.....\$250,000

To provide forgivable loans and emergency grants for low income homeowners to upgrade homes to minimum housing standards.

7. CDBG Administration..... \$ 59,800

To administer and monitor CDBG Program, assuring compliance with all related requirements, reporting and program regulations.

TOTAL PROJECTED FUNDING.....\$666,395

The Completion of the above listed projects will not cause any displacement of persons from their homes.
