

RESOLUTION NO. 16-93

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION IN THE AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING \$959,285.00 FOR FEDERAL FUNDS UNDER THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT AND DESIGNATING JAMES A. PRUGEL AS CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE PURPOSE OF GIVING REQUIRED ASSURANCES AND ACTING IN CONNECTION WITH SAID APPLICATION, AND DECLARING THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the City of Mesquite is entitled to certain funds under the Housing and Community Development Act of an amount not to exceed \$959,285.00 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds for the 1993-94 program year; and,

WHEREAS, the City has conducted public hearings; and,

WHEREAS, the Mesquite City Council has considered the suggestions and recommendations raised at the hearings; and,

WHEREAS, it is the public interest of the citizens of the City of Mesquite that application be made for such funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the 1993-94 Final Statement of Community Development Objectives and Projected Use of CDBG FUNDS is hereby approved and adopted by the City of Mesquite as its official 1993-94 Community Development Block Grant Program.

SECTION 2. James A. Prugel, City Manager of the City of Mesquite, is hereby authorized to file an application for funds under the Housing and Community Development Act on behalf of the City of Mesquite, Texas, and to certify to all understandings and assurances required under Federal Management Circular 74-4; National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Acts of 1964 and 1968 respectively, Executive Orders 11063 and 11246 and such other assurances and understandings as may be required.

SECTION 3. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage as the Charter in such cases provided.

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

NOTICE OF FINAL STATEMENT
OF
OBJECTIVES AND PROJECTED USE
1993-94 FUNDS
CITY OF MESQUITE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT
BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

The Community Development objective of the City of Mesquite is to assure decent, viable living areas and conditions for low and moderate income residents through projects and activities which stabilize and improve low and moderate income neighborhoods by elimination of blighting influences and through the provision of public facilities and services. Activities proposed to be undertaken with available funds are as follows: (Available funds for Grant Year 1993-94 total \$959,285):

1. Latchkey Care Program \$23,880
To continue providing after school care for low income Latchkey Children at Seabourn, Black, Shands, Hanby and Molley Elementary Schools.
2. Code Enforcement 96,836
A program to provide Code Enforcement in low and moderate income areas.
3. Edgemont Park 135,000
Reconstruction of the drainage system in the Edgemont Park area, which may include some curb, gutter and street improvements.
4. Building and Facility Accessibility 91,690
A Program to provide building and facility accessibility to the disabled citizens of Mesquite.
5. Sewer Line Replacement 98,437
To replace deteriorated sewer line in Cedar Drive, from Walker Street to Wildwood Drive.
6. Evans Community Center 25,000
Rehab and remodel of Evans Community Center to accommodate City's Youth Services Program.
7. Planning 78,642
To undertake review and update of current supplementary studies to assure adequate guidelines for development in order to protect and stabilize existing neighborhoods while accommodating growth in an orderly manner.

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8.	Housing Rehabilitation Assistance	250,000
	To provide forgivable loans and emergency grants for low income homeowners to upgrade homes to minimum housing standards.	
9.	CDBG Administration	59,800
	To administer and monitor CDBG Program, assuring compliance with all related requirements, reporting and program regulations.
