A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN ELECTION AGREEMENT AND ELECTION SERVICES CONTRACT; AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Mesquite, Texas, has called a special election to be held August 14, 1999, for the purpose of determining whether to adopt an additional one-half of one percent sales and use tax to be used for projects authorized by Section 4B, Article 5190.6, Vernon's Annotated Texas Civil Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> That the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute an election agreement and election services contract in substantially the form and substance as attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

SECTION 2. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon date of passage.

ELECTION SERVICES CONTRACT

BETWEEN

DALLAS COUNTY

AND

CITY OF MESQUITE (COM)

TO BE HELD SATURDAY, AUGUST 14, 1999

TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE DALLAS COUNTY ELECTIONS DEPARTMENT

I. JURISDICTION

The City of Mesquite (COM) plans to hold a Special Election on August 14, 1999 in thirty-nine (39) Dallas County voting precincts. This contract for election services between COM and the Dallas County Elections Administrator is authorized by Subchapter D of Chapter 31, Texas Election Code.

II. ADMINISTRATION

The Dallas County Elections Administrator agrees to coordinate, supervise and handle all aspects of administering the special election in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code and as outlined in this agreement. COM agrees to pay Dallas County for equipment, supplies, services and administrative costs as outlined in this agreement. The Dallas County Elections Administrator will serve as administrator for the Election; however, COM remains responsible for the lawful conduct of their election.

III. LEGAL DOCUMENTS

COM will be responsible for preparation, adoption and publication of all required election orders, resolutions, notices and any other pertinent documents required by their governing body.

COM will be responsible for making the submission required by the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, with regard to any changes which require preclearance by U.S. Department of Justice. A copy of the submission will be furnished to Dallas County. Preparation of necessary bilingual materials for notices and preparation of the text for the official ballot will also be the responsibility of COM. COM will provide a copy of their respective election notices to the Dallas County Elections Administrator.

IV. DIRECT RECORD VOTING SYSTEM/OPTICAL SCAN

COM agrees that voting at the special election will be by use of a direct record voting system and optical scan system approved by the Secretary of State in accordance with the Texas Election Code. The Dallas County Elections Department will be responsible for the preparation of programs and the testing of the direct record system and optical scan system used for tabulating the ballots. Testing of the direct record equipment will be conducted at the Health and Human Service Bldg, 2377 N. Stemmons, Ste. 800, Dallas beginning July 22, 1999 at 10:00am and testing of the optical scan equipment will be conducted at the Election Equipment Warehouse, 1506 East Langdon Road, Hutchins beginning August 2, 1999 at 10:00am, and before ballots are tabulated at the scheduled polling locations listed in Attachment "B" by the presiding judge.

The Dallas County Elections Department agrees to establish a central counting station to receive and tabulate the voted ballots as outlined in Section IX of this agreement.

Dallas County agrees to provide precinct tabulators and voting booths for the special election. Voting booth allocation will be based on providing one voting booth for each 300 registered voters in each election precinct unit, not to exceed (five) voting booths in any given precinct unit and one precinct tabulator per location.

It is estimated that forty(40) voting booths, eight (8) precinct tabulators, five (5) votronics and one (1) supervisor terminal will be needed to conduct the August 14, 1999 special election. The direct record voting system for the election will be determined by multiplying the total number of votronics by \$130.00 each. The cost for the use of the voting booths will be \$15.00 each. The cost for the use of the precinct tabulators will be \$130.00 each (See Attachment "A").

V. VOTING LOCATIONS

The Elections Administrator will select and arrange for the use of and payment for the voting locations, subject to the approval of COM. Voting locations will be, whenever possible, the usual voting locations for the precincts. The proposed

voting locations are listed in Attachment "B" of this agreement. In the event a voting location is not available, the Elections Administrator will arrange for use of an alternate location with the approval of COM. The Elections Administrator will notify COM of any changes from the locations listed in Attachment "B".

The Elections Administrator will send COM a final version of Attachment "B" which reflects the actual locations to be used on the day of the election.

VI. ELECTION JUDGES, CLERKS AND OTHER ELECTION PERSONNEL

The Elections Administrator will be responsible for the appointment of the presiding judges and alternates for the polling locations subject to the approval of COM. The Elections Administrator shall arrange for the training and compensation of all presiding judges and clerks. The proposed election judges are listed in Attachment "C" of this agreement. If a person is unable or unwilling to serve, the Elections Administrator will name a judge for the precinct. Once a person has been notified of his/her selection as election judge, no changes may be made by COM.

The Elections Administrator is responsible for notifying the election judges of the eligibility requirements of Subchapter C of Chapter 32 of the Texas Election Code, and will take the necessary steps to insure that the election judges appointed for the Special Election are eligible to serve. The presiding judge, with the Elections Department assistance, will be responsible for insuring the eligibility of each appointed clerk hired to assist the judges in the conduct of the election.

The Elections Administrator will send COM an updated version of Attachment "C" which reflects the names of the judges who were sent the letter requesting service for this election, and a final version for Attachment "C" which reflects the name of the judges who actually presided on the day of the election.

The Elections Department will hold one (1) public school of instruction on the use of optical scan voting equipment and election laws on August 12,1999 from 6:30pm to 8:30pm at Dunford Recreation Center, 1015 Green Canyon, Mesquite (If Needed). No election judge will be appointed unless he/she has attended one of the election judge training session taught by the Elections Department.

The election judges are responsible for picking up election supplies at the time and place determined by the Elections Department (which will be set forth in the election judges letter requesting service for this election). Each election judge and clerk will receive \$6.00 per hour (for a maximum of 14 hours). The election judges will receive an additional \$25.00 for picking up the election supplies prior to election day and for delivering election returns and supplies to the central counting station at the Mesquite Municipal Center, 1515 N. Galloway, Mesquite, after the polls close.

The Elections Administrator will employ other personnel necessary for the proper administration of the election, including such part-time help as is necessary to prepare for the election, to ensure the timely delivery of supplies and equipment during the period of early voting and on election day, and for the efficient tabulation of ballots at the central counting station. Part-time personnel will be paid an amount agreed to by the participating authorities as outlined in Attachment "A". Part-time personnel working in support of the central counting station on election night will receive pay for at least four hours, minimum call for service, regardless of the actual hours worked.

VII. SUPPLIES AND PRINTING

The Elections Department will arrange for all election supplies and election printing, including, but not limited to, all forms, signs and other materials used by the election judges at the voting locations.

COM shall furnish the Elections Administrator with the ballot wording showing the exact manner in which the propositions shall appear on the official ballot. COM will be responsible for proofreading and approving their ballot.

VIII. OPTICAL SCAN CARD BALLOTS

The ballot allocation for this election is based on providing enough ballots in every reporting precinct to handle the same turnout as in comparable elections plus 30 percent (30%) of that number, for an original allocation of no less than 30% of the registered voters.

IX. RETURNS OF ELECTIONS

The Elections Department will be responsible for establishing and operating the central counting station to

receive and tabulate the voted ballots in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code and of this agreement.

COM, in accordance with Section 127.002, 127.003 and 127.005 of the Texas Election Code, appoint the following central counting station officials:

Manager

- Bruce R. Sherbet Dallas County Elections Administrator
- Tabulating Supervisor ES & S Representative
- Presiding Judge Ellen Williams City Secretary

The Manager or his representative will deliver timely cumulative reports of the election results as precincts are tabulated. The manager will be responsible for releasing cumulative totals and precinct returns from the election to COM, the press, and general public. Dallas County will operate an election result center to release election results at the Mesquite Municipal Center, 1515 N. Galloway, Mesquite, Texas. COM, upon request, may require release of returns be given only at a specified location other than from the result center.

The Dallas County Elections Department will prepare the unofficial canvass report after all precincts have been counted, and will deliver a copy of the unofficial canvass to COM as soon as possible after all returns have been tabulated. COM will be responsible for the official canvass of their election.

The Dallas County Elections Department will be responsible for conducting the post election manual recount, unless a waiver is given from Secretary of State in accordance with Section 127.201 of the Texas Election Code. Notification and copies of the recount will be provided if necessary.

X. ELECTION EXPENSES

Anticipated expenses for the election are outlined in Attachment "A". A general supervisory fee not to exceed 10% of the total cost of the election shall be assessed as authorized by the Texas Election Code, Section 31.100. Final election expenses will be determined within approximately 120 days after the election. If additional funds are needed, the Elections Administrator will bill COM or any amount remaining will be refunded.

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XI. DEPOSIT OF FUNDS

COM agrees to deposit with the Dallas County Treasurer's Office, by no later than July 19, 1999, a sum equal to the total estimated cost of election expenses to be paid by Dallas County as administrator of the special election, such funds to be placed in a special election account to be used by the County for paying expenses as outlined in this agreement. No funds will be expended by Dallas County except for supplies and services outlined in this agreement, or except as may be agreed to, in writing, by COM.

The amount to be deposited is \$18,885.71

XII. RECORDS OF THE ELECTION

Ellen Williams, City Secretary, is hereby appointed general custodian of the voted ballots and all records of the special election as authorized by Section 31.096 of the Texas Election Code.

Access to the election records will be available to COM as well as to the public in accordance with the Texas Public Information Act, Chapter 552 of Texas Local Government Code, at the Elections Department, 2377 N. Stemmons Frwy, Dallas, Texas, at any time during normal business hours. The Election Administrator shall ensure that the records are maintained in an orderly manner, so that records are clearly identifiable and retrievable per records storage container.

Records of the election will be retained and disposed of in accordance with the records retention schedules which may have been adopted by COM, and in accordance with the provisions of Title 6, Subtitle C, Chapters 201 through 205, Texas Local Government Code, including the minimum retention requirements established by the Texas State Library and Archives Commission. If records of the election are involved in any pending election contest, investigation, litigation, or Texas Public Information Act, the Election Administrator shall maintain the records until final resolution or until final judgement, whichever is applicable. It is the responsibility of COM to bring to the attention of the Elections Administrator any notice of any pending election contest, investigation, litigation, or Texas Public Information Request Act which may be filed with COM. Upon request to maintain records beyond eligibility for preservation according with Section 66.058 of the Texas Election Code, the County shall supply a written cost estimate for storage to COM. (See Section X)

On the first business day which follows the date that the records of the election are eligible for destruction, the Election Administrator will notify in writing COM of the planned destruction of any records of the election. Within fifteen days of receipt of the Election Administrator's notice of intent to destroy the records, COM will provide the Election Administrator with written authorization to proceed with destruction or written instructions to withhold destruction.

XIII. EARLY VOTING

Ellen Williams, City Secretary, will be appointed as early voting clerk in compliance with Sections 31.097 of the Texas Election Code. Bruce R. Sherbet, Elections Administrator, will be appointed as chief deputy early voting clerk. Other deputy early voting judges/clerks will be appointed, subject to the approval of COM, as needed to process early voting mail and to conduct early voting at the one (1) early voting site. (See Attachment "D")

Early voting by personal appearance will be conducted beginning Wednesday, July 28, 1999, and continuing through Friday, July 30, 1999, between 8:00am and 5:00pm; Monday, August 2, 1999, and continuing through Friday, August 6, 1999, between 8:00am and 5:00pm: Saturday, August 7, 1999 between 8:00am and 5:00pm; Monday, August 9, 1999, and continuing through Tuesday, August 10, 1999 between 7:00am and 7:00pm. Any qualified voter for the special election may vote early by personal appearance at:

All requests for early voting ballots by mail that are received by COM will be transported by runner on the day of receipt to the Dallas County Elections Department, 8th Floor, 2377 N. Stemmons Frwy, Suite 820, for processing. Persons voting by mail will send their voted ballots to the Dallas County Elections Department.

All early voting ballots from in person and by mail will be prepared for counting by an early voting Ballot Board appointed in accordance with Section 87.001 of the Texas Election Code. COM will consent to allow Dallas County Elections Department to appoint the presiding Ballot Board judge no later than July 19, 1999 or forward a recommendation.

XIV. NOTICE

Whenever this agreement requires any consent, approval notice, request or demand, it must be in writing to be effective and shall be delivered to the party intended to receive it as shown below:
