THE HOUSING CHOICE VOUCHER PROGRAM.



WHEREAS, in accordance with Title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Subtitle B, Chapter IX, Part 903, "Public Housing Agency Plans," the City of Mesquite must certify that any revisions since the last submission of the Annual Plan have been listed in the new Annual Plan, that the Resident Advisory Board has had the opportunity to review and comment on the changes to the policies and programs before implementation, and that the changes were approved by the City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESQUITE, TEXAS:



Streamlined Annual PHA Plan <i>(HCV Only PHAs)</i>	U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Office of Public and Indian Housing	OMB No. 2577-0226 Expires 02/29/2016
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Purpose. The 5-Year and Annual PHA Plans provide a ready source for interested parties to locate basic PHA policies, rules, and requirements concerning the PHA's operations, programs, and services, and informs HUD, families served by the PHA, and members of the public of the PHA's mission, goals and objectives for serving the needs of low- income, very low- income, and extremely low- income families

- (2) **Small PHA** - A PHA that is not designated as PHAS or SEMAP troubled, or at risk of being designated as troubled, that owns or manages less than 250 public housing units and any number of vouchers where the total combined units exceeds 550.
- (3) **Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Only PHA** - A PHA that administers more than 550 HCVs, was not designated as troubled in its most recent SEMAP assessment, and does not own or manage public housing.
- (4) **Standard PHA** - A PHA that owns or manages 250 or more public housing units and any number of vouchers where the total combined units exceeds 550, and that was designated as a standard performer in the most recent PHAS and SEMAP assessments.
- (5) **Troubled PHA** - A PHA that achieves an overall PHAS or SEMAP score of less than 60 percent.
- (6) **Qualified PHA** - A PHA with 550 or fewer public housing dwelling units and/or housing choice vouchers combined, and is not PHAS or SEMAP troubled.

B. 1 -Housing Needs and Strategy for Addressing Housing Needs. (Attachment A)

The Mesquite Housing Division only administers Housing Choice Vouchers. The Housing Division administers 1,404 Tenant Based Housing Choice Vouchers and has 1, 887 on the waiting list. The housing needs provided in the City of Mesquite's Consolidated Plan and the Mesquite Housing Divisions current waiting list does agree with basic needs in our area.

Of the 1,404 families receiving housing choice vouchers from the Mesquite Housing division, 512 are disabled families and 547 of the families on the waiting list are disabled. The need for accessible units for those in the HCV program in Mesquite is larger than the need citywide. As the City continues to grow in population, the need for affordable housing will increase especially for the low and moderate income since the primary housing problem in the City of Mesquite is cost burden. The Mesquite Housing Division will work with several organizations in their anti-poverty strategy to provide affordable housing, safe and preserved neighborhoods, and supportive service to the very low-income residents.

The housing needs provided in the City of Mesquite's Consolidated Plan and the Mesquite Housing Divisions current waiting list does agree with basic needs in our area. The waiting list is comprised of the following:

B. 2- New Activities. (Attachment B)

Description of Project Based Housing:

Project site – 4540 Gus Thomasson Road Mesquite, Texas 75150

Total number of units in project covered by this Agreement – There 18 units dedicated to the project based voucher program. For the property itself there are 155 units.

**Location of contract units on site – 1Br - #1309,1108,2320,3110,3202,3204,1208,1209,2220
--2Br-#1307, 1311, 3111,3201,3211,3311,4133,4134,4136**

Number of contract units by area (size) and number of bedrooms and bathrooms – 9 1Br / 1 Ba and 9 2Br / 2 Ba.

Services, maintenance, or equipment to be supplied by the owner without charges in addition to the rent to owner – Property will have a fitness center, a community room and pool available without charge.

Utilities available to the contract units, including a specification of utility services to be paid by owner (without charges in addition to rent) and utility services to be paid by the tenant – Tenant pays unit electrical. Owner pays trash, water and sewer.

Estimated initial rent to owner for the contract units – initial rents of \$728 for 1Br / 1Ba and \$887 for 2Br / 2Ba.

Comments for RAB:

- Move-out counseling for participants. The importance of having a savings account for move out expenses. (ex. deposits, utilities and application fees)
- How credit scores impact you whether or not you are a voucher holder.
- Provide additional resources other than housing.
- Lower rents
- Need additional landlords/ apartment complexes

Summary:

The Mesquite Housing Division has hired a Housing Inspector/Landlord Services who will focus on outreach to new owners with properties and apartment complexes. When issuing vouchers caseworkers will continue to counsel applicants/participants on the current rental market. They will also educate clients on the benefits of having a savings account. We will offer more courses on money management, good housing keeping practices and career counseling. We will continue to encourage clients to find units in less poverty stricken areas.
