WHEREAS, on June 21, 2021, the Mesquite City Council approved Resolution No. 34-2021 authorizing the City Manager to execute an Interlocal Agreement with the cities of Balch Springs, Seagoville, and the Town of Sunnyvale to create the Southeast Collaboration Crisis Intervention Team ("Team") and establishing the governance of the program by the Southeast Alliance Governance Board per the provisions of the Grant; and

WHEREAS, on August 16, 2021, the Mesquite City Council approved Resolution No. 44-2021 authorizing the City Manager to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with Dallas County Hospital District d/b/a Parkland Health and Hospital System for staffing for one mental health response team consisting of one social worker and one emergency medical technician/paramedic for Fiscal Year 2021-22; and

WHEREAS, due to the success and resulting demand being put on this new response resource, the Southeast Alliance Governance Board voted on January 11, 2022, to add a second response team; and

WHEREAS, on April 18, 2022, the Mesquite City Council approved Resolution No. 18-2022 authorizing the City Manager to execute the Amendment No. 1 to the Interlocal Agreement with the Dallas County Hospital District which included (a) restating the agreed to price of \$176,089.00 per year for the first mental health response team (\$14,674.08 per month); (b) adding a second team consisting of one social worker and one paramedic for the price of \$180,000.00 per year (\$15,000.00 per month) starting on May 1, 2022; (c) changing the payment terms from yearly to monthly; (d) extending the current term of the Interlocal Agreement to September 30, 2023; and (e) adding the required medical direction fee for both teams (fee included in the price of the second team); and

WHEREAS, the Grant for the Team provides 100 percent funding for this agreement for the grant period; and

WHEREAS, the term of the Grant was for one-year from May 1, 2021, to April 30, 2022, with a one-year extension available upon approval of Dallas County and the Cities; and


